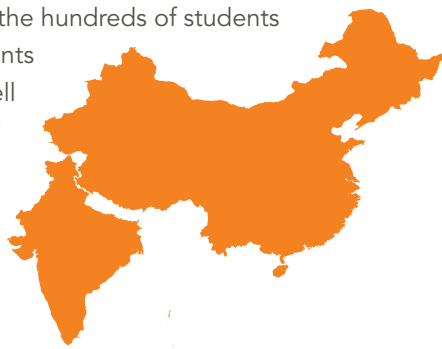




# Welcoming International Students to Mohawk

## Right out of the Gate

During the September 2018 startup, Mohawk College partnered with McMaster University, Columbia International College and the City of Hamilton to deliver a bright and warm welcome to newly arriving international students at Pearson International Airport. The presence of volunteers in bright orange shirts was hard to miss at both terminals for the duration of the month of August. Students were not only greeted, they were given information on how to get to Hamilton, offered free calls home at the iCent booth, given help to establish wi-fi connections and to access currency exchange, and offered general information about Mohawk College. Over 350 Mohawk students were helped by this service and the team will be picking up again next summer for a full month of welcoming our students.



## Thanksgiving Coffee Club

Every two weeks students, staff and faculty are welcome to partake in Coffee Club - a conversation club coordinated by International Coach Jacques Heri Soares da Silva which engages international and domestic students in discussions and group activities. Thanksgiving Coffee Club was amazing! We had a great turnout where students and staff participated in many games, including a "Kahoot" (interactive quiz) with questions about the history of Thanksgiving, and differences between Canadian and American Thanksgiving. ## International Student Orientation

On September 6th, almost 450 new international students joined us in the McIntyre Theatre for their New Student Orientation. The Orientation event for new students is an exposure to programming, supports, workshops and leadership opportunities unique to international student needs. As part of the event, students enjoyed the motivational messaging and music of Blake Fly, who spoke about the importance of getting involved, and breaking out of your comfort zone to make new connections.

We also hosted a trivia contest which engaged the students in voting for their burning questions as new students, supported by services like the MSA, Guard Me, and Mo Money. Students also had an opportunity to enter a draw to win funds on their OneCards that could go toward expenses on campus like textbooks, and were treated to a meal and networking after the event. 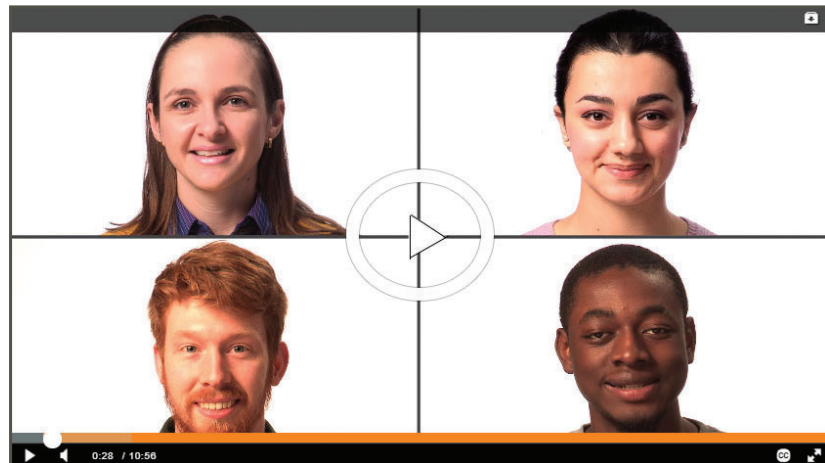
## Teaching & Learning Consultant - International Education (CTL)

# Students Taking Flight

Through the Career Ready fund, a provincial government grant that supports the development of experiential learning opportunities for students, Mohawk College received funding to develop and enhance experiential learning opportunities both on and off campus. Part of the fund was dedicated to increasing global experiences for domestic students through international service learning trips to Jamaica, India and Greece. Mohawk's ultimate goal is to provide experiential learning opportunities to each student, thereby enhancing their educational experience and allowing them to be "career ready." The service learning trips to Greece and Jamaica took place in the fall of 2018.

Under the guidance of Kelley Hoyt, Teaching & Learning Consultant - International in the Centre for Teaching & Learning, Ryan Iles, Professor of Liberal Studies and Elyse Pipitone, Manager, LCC & Short-Term Programs, 12 students participated in a Global Experience to Chalkida, Greece from October 16-27, 2018. Students alongside faculty and staff worked at the Ritsona Refugee Camp for approximately 30 hours. The team helped in various capacities including providing supplies to residents at the distribution centre, helping families with their clothing needs at the Ritsona "Shop," helping residents in the laundry facilities, and interacting with women and children in the "Female Friendly" space.

Formerly an air force base, the Ritsona Refugee Camp was funded by the United Arab Emirates and the Red Cross to address the influx of asylum seekers that began entering Greece in 2015.

The team had the opportunity to learn about the refugee crisis in Greece and

the toll it has taken on the country as well as the asylum seekers who are fleeing their homes.

During the trip Kelley, Ryan, Elyse and one of the students presented live from Greece at the Great Ideas for Teaching (GIFT) conference which is offered each reading week by the Centre for Teaching & Learning. The team discussed how learning abroad experiences can be beneficial for intercultural competency development. Kelley, Ryan & Elyse are extremely proud of this team

of professional, courageous, kind and compassionate students who worked hard every step of the way!

The trip was part of the "Global Experience" 3 credit General elective course and students prepared heavily in advance and completed post-trip assignments as part of the course. The goal of the course is to increase intercultural and global competencies of students.





## Project Jamaica

Students from the Computer Networking, Computer Software, Photography and Building Renovation programs were part of a trip of a lifetime where they were able to use their skills from their program of study to enhance Bowden Hill Primary, a rural school in the mountains of Bowden Hill, Jamaica. This opportunity provided Mohawk students with a unique work integrated learning experience where computer students installed 10 laptops and 4 projectors and facilitated workshops for students. The building and renovation students measured and developed specification drawings for much needed storage units and a new kitchen and the photography students captured every moment of the journey.

The week was filled with many cultural learning experiences from visiting Fern Gully, Craft Market Devon House and the Bob Marley Museum; however the true learning came from the time spent at Bowden Hill Primary. Mohawk students immersed themselves in each of the classrooms and quickly won the hearts of the Jamaican students and teachers.



The week culminated in a community celebration, hosted by Bowden Hill Primary and Mohawk College. Attended by over 300 parents and the broader Bowden Hill community, the event celebrated the collaboration of Project Jamaica and showcased the work that Mohawk students completed in a short period of time.

The last day concluded with a visit to the Embassy to meet with the Canadian High Commissioner Lori Peters; students discussed with Lori their interest in Project Jamaica. Mohawk staff and students had an incredible experience which provided a foundation for new learning opportunities for the students at Bowden Hill Primary.

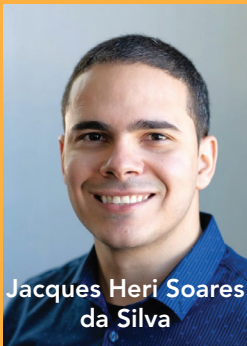
## Welcome, Irene Walker, to English for Academic Purposes
