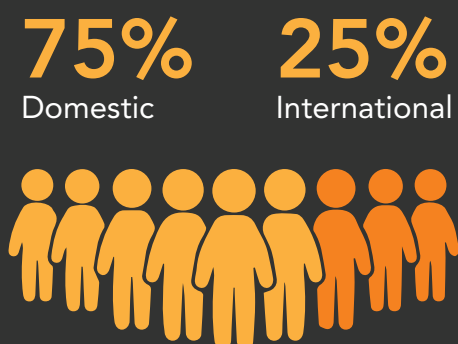

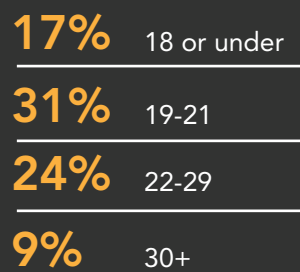
Student Services 2019

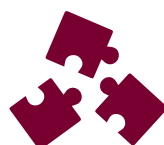
