Formerly The Mohawk College Singers, the Mohawk College Community Choir is quickly becoming one of the finest choral ensembles in the Hamilton area. It was founded by Patricia Rolston in 1968 to participate in the opening of the college's Fennel Campus. Since then, it has grown into a 75 member semi-professional college/community choral society with singers from all walks of life who have their vocal talent and love of choral music in common. The choir performs a large variety of music - from chamber music to the greatest large scale works in the choral repertoire, with and without orchestra. Concerts have been performed with Symphony Hamilton, the University of Guelph Symphony and the Brantford Symphony Orchestra (premiering Alun Hoddinott's Bells of Paradise). The Mohawk College Community Choir has also performed with the McMaster University choir and full orchestra including Brahms' Ein Deutsches Requiem, Haydn's Lord Nelson Mass and Vaughan Williams' Dona Concerts are held in various venues throughout the Hamilton/Dundas/Niagara areas as well as on the Mohawk campus. Accompanist Lucy Bledig has developed an enjoyably versatile musical career. Born and raised in Thunder Bay, she first completed a Bachelor degree in Science at Lakehead University before moving to London, Ontario to study music at the University of Western Ontario. While there, Lucy completed her Masters degree in Vocal Literature and Performance and her Associate Diploma in piano performance

from the Royal Conservatory of Music. Her vocal instructors have included Kevin McMillan and Elise Bédard and masterclasses with Elly Ameling, Stewart Hamilton, and Gidon Saks. Ms. Bledig has been a soloist with the Mohawk College Community Choir in past seasons and is thrilled to have the honour of being their accompanist this season. Lucy has also accompanied the McMaster University Choir, several of the University of Western Ontario choirs including London's St. Cecilia's choir, and many solo vocalists and musical theatre productions



As a soprano she has performed in such operas as *The Magic Flute, Ariadne auf Naxos* and *The Old Maid and The Thief* and continues to perform in concerts and recitals throughout Ontario. Ms. Bledig is in great demand as a private voice, piano, and theory instructor and is active as church choir director and organist. Having recently moved to Hamilton ON, Lucy is enjoying becoming part of the Hamilton music community.


David Holler - Conductor



David Holler is active as an orchestral and choral conductor, tenor soloist and private music instructor. He received his Bachelor of Music degree in Music Education from the University of Western Ontario and then went on to complete a Master of Music degree in Choral Conducting from Westminster Choir College in Princeton, NJ. As a member of the Westminster Choir, the Westminster

Symphonic Choir, and the Westminster Singers, Mr. Holler performed regularly with the New York Philharmonic, the Philadelphia Orchestra, and the New Jersey Symphony, as well as being a member of the opera chorus in residence for two summers in the Festival dei Due Mondi in Spoleto, Italy, and Charleston, South Carolina. In the Niagara region, Mr. Holler is the founding music director of the Mercredi Musique String Chamber Ensemble & Chorus and has conducted the Peninsula Orchestra and the Niagara Children's Chorus. He has been a guest conductor with the Westminster Community Orchestra and assistant conductor with the Lawrenceville Community Orchestra in New Jersey. As well as teaching private music lessons in the Niagara area, Mr. Holler is the assistant organist at St. Julia's Church and is very active as a tenor soloist and accompanist. As a tenor soloist, Mr. Holler has performed with York University's Professional Opera Training Workshop, and most recently he has had leading roles in Summer Opera Lyric Theatre's 2005 presentations of Mozart's The Magic Flute and Haydn's Il mondo della luna. Mr. Holler has appeared in several solo and chamber music concerts with the Niagara International Chamber Music Festival in Niagara-on-the-Lake and continues to perform recitals in the Niagara region. In Hamilton, he has directed the McMaster University Choir and is currently the music director of the Mohawk College Community Choir. In the fall of 2010, Mr. Holler began working on his Doctorate of Musical Arts in Choral Conducting at the University of Toronto with Dr. Hilary Apfelstadt. He hopes to continue teaching at the university level in the future.
